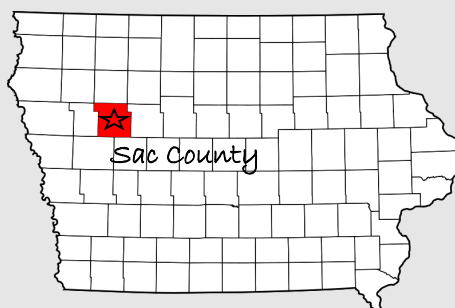

A young girl came to the FDC because she was stranded in Sac City, and did not have a car, money, or food. Our coordinator was able to contact the Sac City Police Department and obtain a motel voucher, and a voucher for a meal at a local cafe, getting the girl out of the cold temperatures. We helped her contact a family member who was willing to come and get her and gave her warm gloves and clean clothes.
